

Steve Seall

- One of the league's tallest players, Steve was also one of the great pitchers of his era---he often had bloody fingers during a game because of throwing his famous slow-pitch knuckle ball. He also had a knack for striking out some of the league's best hitters, often just barely hitting the front of home plate with the pitch
- Steve played hundreds of senior games per year in Florida and Mishawaka
- He won numerous championships with Bubbs and was often in demand for participation on travel teams
- Not only a good pitcher, Steve carried a powerful bat and could hit with power, especially, "gap power" well into his older years
- By the later years of his career Steve was wearing so much protective equipment that he resembled a medieval knight in armor, prompting players to say "that there is absolutely no way he could be hurt by a hit ball".
